

## **SUSTAINABILITY POLICY**

From AQUANARIA's management to each of the departments that make up its internal structure, the company is firmly committed to sustainable development, to adapting to change and continuous improvement, to respecting nature and protecting the environment that may be affected by our activity, to integrating socially committed practices and to sustainable performance. For this reason, a Sustainability Policy has been drafted in accordance with the following principles:

- Define and periodically review the targets and action plans established in compliance with the sustainability strategy and commitment to the SDGs.

- Adopt measures to prevent pollution, constantly assessing the environmental impact of our activities and adopting the necessary precautions and measures to minimise them, establishing appropriate controls for the organisation's significant environmental factors, allowing the:
  - Rational use of natural resources, materials and energy, promoting effective resource management based on control and damage reduction. Optimise energy and water efficiency to full extent.
  - Minimisation or avoidance, as far as possible, of actions that have a negative effect on the biodiversity and natural habitats of the environment based on nature and landscape conservation and enhancement plans.
- Comply with and enforce compliance with good environmental practices and sustainability guidelines by employees and other stakeholders related to the organisation.
- Facilitate transparency and reporting on sustainable performance and on the extent to which commitments linked to the Sustainable Development Goals are being met.
